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Member News: COVID-19 and Opioid Use

Thank you for being a member of Scott and White Health Plan. Today we're writing with information about the increased risk for serious illness from COVID-19 for people taking opioid medications. Keep reading to learn more about the health risks of opioids – and what you can do to stay safe.

Understanding Risks

According to the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)</u>, people who take opioids – whether as treatment for chronic pain or as part of a substance use disorder – are at higher risk of developing severe illness from COVID-19. They are more likely to experience:

- Hospitalization
- Admission to an intensive care unit
- Use of a ventilator for breathing
- Death

Taking opioids affects breathing and the function of the immune system. It also increases a person's risk for accidental overdose.

Increasing Safety

The CDC recommends a COVID-19 vaccine for most people ages 12 years and older. Learn more about the **safety and effectiveness of vaccines**, and **sign up for a vaccine at no cost**. Getting a COVID-19 vaccine helps protect against infection and serious illness, which is especially important for people taking opioids.

Another way to increase safety is to keep naloxone on hand. Naloxone is a medication that can stop or reverse an opioid overdose when it's happening. Naloxone is available as a nasal spray (Narcan®) or as an injection, and your doctor or pharmacist can teach you how to use it.

If you or someone in your household is taking opioids, having naloxone available can help save a life during an overdose emergency. Talk to your doctor or pharmacist about obtaining naloxone and Narcan® Nasal Spray.
